Sue and her fellow staff members were treated to an evening of celebration and entertainment at BAWA Club, Filton following another successful year for the charitable social enterprise.

Of the win, Sue said: "I'm absolutely thrilled to bits, if a little shocked and surprised. I had absolutely no idea that I was going to receive the award and it only clicked once Mark was half way through his speech!"

"I've seen a lot of changes in my 30 years at Kingswood Active Lifestyle Centre – especially with the computer systems! Throughout it all, I've always loved my job, my colleagues and the customers we meet every day. I'll be behind the desk for a long while yet!"

Mark Crutchley, Chief Executive of Circadian Trust, said: "It's been an exceptional year for the Trust, with major redevelopments in Bradley Stoke, Longwell Green and Yate coming to a close. I'd like to thank my staff for making all of this possible.

"This years' Lifetime Achievement Award has been awarded to someone who has shown passion, loyalty and dedication to great customer service throughout their career with Circadian Trust. And this is just one of many reasons that I had great pleasure in presenting the award to Sue."

Other awards included Team of the Year, Employee of the Year, Centre of the Year, Chairman's Special Award and five Quality Standards Awards in Health and Fitness, Customer Service, Swimming, Food and Beverage and Operations.

Since 2010 Circadian Trust has seen an 18% increase in customer uptake to 2.5 million customer visits per year and growth in turnover by 7.6% to £11.5million in the last financial year, with £7million re-invested into new initiatives within the local community.
